In his letter, Sri Maurya has stated that he is willing to pursue LL.M. course from Kurukshetra University through distance learning mode (correspondence). There is no necessity to join any classes for the course and the only requirement is to attend the examination. He has, therefore, requested the Court to grant him permission to pursue the LL.M. degree course through correspondence.

In this connection it is submitted that Sri Maurya is a newly appointed officer. He is willing to pursue the course through distance learning mode (correspondence) and as such, there appears to be no necessity to join any classes. However, acceptance of his request is on the discretion of the Court. It is also submitted that a judicial officer can be accorded permission to attend academic classes and specialized higher studies in terms of G.O.No. 24/1066-Appointment (B) dated 21.08.1967 (copy at flag X), subject to the following conditions: -

- (1) Government work should not suffer in any way.
- (2) The academic classes are held outside office hours.
- (3) No preferential treatment will be given in the matter of leave, postings and transfer.
- (4) The permission can be withdrawn without notice if; it is found at any time that the government servant neglects his normal work or that public work suffers, in any way.

Under the circumstances, if approved by Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Sri Kamlesh Kumar Maurya. Additional Civil Judge (Junior Division), Kanpur Dehat may be accorded permission to pursue the course of LL.M. from Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Haryana through correspondence, as requested, subject to the conditions mentioned above?
