
In the letter, Sri Rai has stated that he want to study LL.M. from Kurukshetra University by distant education for session starting from September 2009, since it relates to his present service & it will help him in acquiring better knowledge of the subjects and because of distant education mode, it will not affect him adversely from discharging his official duties. He has, therefore, requested for grant of permission to do study of LL.M.

In this connection it is submitted that Sri Rai has joined the U.P. Nyayik Sewa on 21.06.2006. His case may be considered as the course has to be done through correspondence and there appears to be no necessity to join any classes. However, acceptance of his request is on the discretion of the Court. It is also submitted that a judicial officer can be accorded permission to attend academic classes and specialized higher studies in terms of G.O.No. 24/1066-Appointment (B) dated 21.08.1967 (copy at flag X), subject to the following conditions: -

- (1) Government work should not suffer in any way.
- (2) The academic classes are held outside office hours. The Head of the Department should verify from the educational institutions concerned the hours during which classes will be held and permission should be given only in cases where these hours are clearly beyond the prescribed office hours.
- (3) No preferential treatment will be given in the matter of leave, postings and transfer.
- (4) The permission can be withdrawn without notice if; it is found at any time that the government servant neglects his normal work or that public work suffers, in any way.

Under the circumstances, if approved by Hon'ble the Chief Justice, Sri Nitish Kumar Rai, Civil Judge (Jr. Div.), Bansi (Siddharth Nagar) may be accorded permission to do LL.M. through correspondence, from the session starting in September 2009, from Kurukshetra University, Haryana, as requested, subject to the conditions mentioned above?
