May kindly see the letters at flag 'A', 'A-1' & 'A-2', received from Sri. Siddharth Singh, Addl. Civil Judge (Jr. Div.), Varanasi regarding grant of permission to get transferred Tata Indigo car in his name from his wife's name.

In the letters, Sri. Singh has stated that his wife Smt. Archana Singh owns a Tata Indigo car bearing registration No. UP-32-BQ-8844, which was gifted to her in marriage by her father Sri. R.P. Singh, the then A.D.M., Banda, purchased for a sum of Rs.5,16,502/- through finance from Magma Leasing Ltd., which was taken by his father-in-law in the name of his daughter (officer's wife) on 14.11.2005 and repaid in full by his father-in-law till 20.10.2006. He has also submitted copies of 'No-dues Certificate' issued by Magma Leasing Ltd. In this regard and Repayment schedule etc., which are at flags 'x' & 'X-1'. As he is using the car and the car is not registered in his name, practical difficulties are there in using the car. His wife is ready to transfer the vehicle in his favour. He has also submitted a copy of registration certificate and consent letter of his wife against the proposed transfer, which are at flags 'B' & 'B-1'. He has, therefore, requested the Court to grant him permission to get the car transferred in his name from his wife's name.

In this connection, it is submitted that the officer had submitted his property statement at the time of his joining in the judicial service (Property Statement is at flag 'C'). The officer has showed the car in in his said Property Statement. It is further submitted that the relevant rule relating to transfer of movable property [Rule-24 (2) of U.P. Government Servant's conduct (Amendment) Rule-1998] runs as under: -

"A Government servant who enters into any transaction concerning any movable property exceeding in value, the amount of his basic pay for one month, whether by way of purchase, sale or otherwise, shall forthwith report such transaction to the appropriate authority; Provided that no Government servant shall inter into any such transaction except with or through a reputed dealer or agent of standing, or with the previous sanction of the appropriate authority."

It is further submitted that as the officer has requested for grant of permission to get transferred the car in his name from his wife's name, he may be granted the permission, as requested, as per the rule referred to above, if the Court deemed fit and proper.

May, therefore, if approved by Hon'ble Mr. Justice V.M.Sahai, Sri. Siddharth Singh, Addl. Civil Judge (Jr. Div.), Varanasi be granted permission to get transferred the Tata Indigo car bearing registration No. UP-32-BQ-8844, in his name from his wife's name, as requested, with the direction that he may furnish copies of the relevant papers of transaction after its completion?
