## Annual remarks recorded by the Administrative Judge/Reviewing and Accepting Authority

Vivek Chaudhary( HON'BLE JUDGE )

The Officer was posted as Additional District & Sessions Judge (Gangster Act), Aligarh from 05.12.2022 to 21.12.2022 and Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Aligarh from 21.12.2022 to 31.03.2023. Prior to that the Officer was posted as Additional District & Sessions Judge (POCSO Act) from 01.04.2022 to 23.05.2022 and from 24.05.2022 to 04.07.2022 as Special Judge (EC Act/ADJ, Saharanpur and from 07.07.2022 to 02.12.2022 as Special Judge (SC/ST Act), Man. The Officer has achieved 2240.78 units against the actual target of 1200 units, which are quite adequate. The Officer has taken keen interest/steps to dispose of old cases of five and ten years old. The Officer also taken steps to reduce the pendency by fixing short dates, avoided unnecessary adjournments and given priority in hearing. The judgments delivered by the Officer appear to be well-reasoned, sound and expressed in good language, appreciating proper evidence and principles of law.

The Officer has proper administrative control over her Office. She enjoys good reputation for her legal acumen and integrity. She has made effective periodical, quarterly and annual, inspection of her Court and offices. She has been fair and impartial in dealing with the public and Bar. The Officer has properly fixed the cause list to keep herself engaged during the full Court hours. She is a soft spoken, courteous and submissive Officer. She has cordial relations with members of Bar and Judicial Officers of the Judgeship. The District Judge has rated her to be a very good Officer.
