The Officer was posted as Additional District & Sessions Judge, Aligarh during the period under assessment.

As per the self assessment form, the Officer has achieved 2334.14 units against the target of 1200 units during the period under assessment which is quite adequate. The Officer has taken keen interest/steps to decide cases and decided sufficient number of cases in the old category. The Officer has also taken steps to reduce pendency by fixing short dates, avoided unnecessary adjournments and given priority in hearing. The judgments delivered by the Officer appear to be well-reasoned, sound and expressed in good language, appreciating proper evidence and principles of law.

The Officer has also proper administrative control over his Court and Office. The Officer has made regular effective inspections of his Court and Offices.
