# Annual remarks recorded by the Administrative Judge/Reviewing and Accepting Authority

# Sadhna Rani (Thakur)( HON'BLE JUDGE )

The District Judge, Auraiya found that the officer did not apply her judicial mind and committed Case Crime No. 29 of 2022 under Sections 377 and 506 IPC, Police Station Ajitmal, District Auraiya to the court of Sessions. Thus, the application of law of the officer was not found proper. It was also found that the officer had no control over the office and she was also not found amenable to the advice of the District Judge. She was found insubordinate as well. She is said to have left the station after taking station leave and visited without seeking prior permission to the Administrative Judge at Allahabad on 27.08.2022. Her conduct was also not found up to the mark.

The officer made a representation which stated that due to heavy work load the file was wrongly committed to the court of sessions regarding which she sought to be excused and as the questionnaire of the inspection of the District Judge was not sent in time, she after seeking explanation of the staff, sought to be excused in the matter. It is also submitted that on 27.08.2022 Hon'ble Mr. Justice Gautam Chaudhary was not the Administrative Judge of the judgeship so the notice issued to her was wrong. She had gone to Hon'ble Mr. Justice Gautam Chaudhary for some personal meeting.

By the same District Judge in the previous year the application of law of the officer was found proper and it is submitted by the officer that since then she has gained experience of one more year so on the basis of her trivial mistakes it cannot be said that she lacks proper application of law. For control on the office and her administrative capacity and tact, it was rated to be good last year by the same District Judge. The officer disposed of as many as 2265, five year old cases and 1370, ten year old cases. Her judgements on facts and law were found sound on the whole, well reasoned and expressed in good language. Her marshalling of facts and appreciation of evidence was also found proper. She achieved 2083.86 units in comparison to the targeted 797.84 units. She has decided 553 cases on merit during the previous year. Her relation with members of bar and behaviour and relation with brother officers is found to be cordial. She is found punctual and regular also.

Thus, the officer being a new officer having first posting at the station, I found the explanation of the officer satisfactory. The adverse entries in Column 1(f)(iii), Column 1(h) and Column 1(m) are expunged. The remarks at Column 4 are also expunged.

In column 1(f)(iii) the application of law of the officer concerned is found 'good'. Regarding column 1(h) her control over office and administrative capacity and tact are also found satisfactory. Regarding Column 1(m) also, she is found amenable to the advice of the District Judge.

The officer is advised to comply with all the circular orders of this court in letter and spirit.
