Annual remarks recorded by the Administrative Judge/Reviewing and Accepting Authority

Vivek Chaudhary(HON'BLE JUDGE)

The Officer was posted as Additional District & Sessions Judge, Barabanki during the period under under assessment. The Officer has achieved 942 units (151%) against the actual target of 623 units, which are adequate. The Officer has taken steps to reduce the pendency by fixing short dates, avoided unnecessary adjournments and given priority in hearing. He has also disposed of 19 old matters of more than five years old. The judgments delivered by the Officer appear to be well-reasoned, sound and expressed in good language, appreciating proper evidence and principles of law.

The Officer has proper administrative control over his Court and Office and has maintained cordial relations with the members of the Bar. He enjoys good reputation for his legal acumen and integrity. He has made effective periodical, quarterly and annual, inspection of his Court and offices. He has been fair and impartial in dealing with the public and Bar. The Officer has properly fixed the cause list to keep himself engaged during the full Court hours. He is a soft spoken, courteous and submissive Officer. He has cordial relations with members of Bar and Judicial Officers of the Judgeship. He has exhibited good respect and sensitivity towards the women.

It is well known that during the entire period under assessment, working in all the establishments including the District Courts has suffered a huge set back due to spread of Pandemic COVID-19 and the discharge of work and output given by the Officers has also been affected significantly.
