Madam,

I am not very pleased to inform you that there are many oral complaints against your working, behaviour and attitude, while doing judicial work, from the side of Bar. I myself personally feel that your behaviour is not upto the mark and it is not like a judge. In this regard, I have instructed you many times earlier but in vain. Hence following directions are being given to you for your future guidance:-

1. Be a judge and behave like a judge not like a executive officer or police officer.
2. Always have patience while you are on Dais or when you are interacting to your seniors or the District Judge under whose subordination you are working and never lose your temper.
3. Do not shout on lawyers and litigants while sitting on Dais.
4. In arrest cases where you are giving remand to accused and surrender cases where you are taking the accused in custody, always remember that he has legal right to move bail application thereafter and you are legally bound to hear his bail application on the same day or any other day mentioning reason why his bail application is not being disposed of on the same day.
5. Always be moderate, not conservative while doing judicial work and mind should always be opened, it should not be closed.
6. Always have control over your court and work. If you are fixing large number of cases and misc. work in a working day and not in condition to hear all of cases and misc. work fixed then you cannot put blame on others for this.
7. Always be amenable to advise of District Judge under whom you are working.

Lastly I hope you will improve yourself in future and you would prove yourself as an ideal judicial officer

Gone through the contents of confidential letter dated 09.06.2020 written by Ms. Madhulika Chaudhary, Special Judge (E.C. Act), Kanpur Nagar in the light of contents of D.O. No. 02/2020 dated 02.03.2020 issued to her. On perusal of contents of aforesaid D.O., it is clear that some directions were given to Ms Chaudhary for her future guidance and her improvement. She was not expected to submit any explanation in response but after a long time (about more than 3 months) a confidential letter has been written by her indirectly stating that District Judge was wrong to give some guidance for her improvement because there was no substantial reason for doing that. According to her "response could not be done due to spread of pandemic COVID-19 and consequential lock-down" but she did not clear this fact that when she was present at the head quarter during lock-down period then who has forbidden not to submit her response soon after D.O. was received. This shows that officer is creating her defence. Being a lady judicial officer, she is trying to put pressure on head of institution under whose subordination she is working.

Ms Madhulika Chaudhary who has service length of about 04 years only, is in habit of committing mistakes and she is also casual in nature. Following are some examples of her casualness.

1. A meeting of Special Judges H.J.S. Cader, C.M.M. and Special C.J.M., Kanpur Nagar was called at my official residence Sessions House on 24.05.2020 for instructing them regarding new modality i.e. disposal of urgent applications/matters through Video Conferencing via virtual court and allotting them time slots. Ms. Madhulika Chaudhary was present in that meeting as a Special Judge (E.C. Act) Kanpur Nagar. She has been asked by me how many urgent applications are fixed in her court on 26.05.2020 and she quickly replied that no urgent/bail application is pending in her court, while 14 urgent applications were pending in her court. She sent apology message on my official mobile number admitting this fact that "regarding number of pending bail, she apprised on the basis of information provided by her Reader, she should have checked it online herself". It shows that she sits in the meeting of the District Judge without updating herself regarding factual position of her court and she has no effective control over her Class III staff who dared to provide her false information. Ms. Chaudhary apology is on record.

2. In the month of May, 2020, ACR of Class III and Class IV employees given by Ms Chaudhary was put up before me on 27.05.2020 for my approval. On going through ACR of employees, it was found that she has not signed on ACR of one of the employee. She was called in my retiring room and directed by me to put her signature on ACR of that employee. She was advised not to be so careless while sending such type of matter to the office of the District Judge. This also shows her casualness.

3. Annual inspection of her court was fixed on 17.01.2020 which was well within her knowledge because administrative order was passed on 04.12.2019 in this regard but till the date of annual inspection of her court and office, information/questionnaire was not provided by her staff because of which there was no option but to change the date of annual inspection of her court and office. This shows she has not taken pain to direct class III employees deputed in her court to prepare questionnaire well within time, prior to attending special training programme on Management for Judicial Officers at JTRI from 13.01.2020 to 17.01.2020.

There are about 70 judicial officers in the Kanpur Nagar Judgeship and it is a big judgeship in which the District Judge has ample judicial and administrative work to perform. He has no time to issue D.O. letter to his judicial officer without any cause. In my view, the District Judge has every prerogative to give advise and direction for improvement of judicial officer. I never been in habit of harassing judicial officer posted in my judgeship and giving them D.O. without being good reason but I am certainly in habit of dealing those judicial officers with iron hand who says I am what I am and I will not improve myself.

It is on record that Ms Madhulika Chaudhary was rated good officer by District Judge in the year 2018-19 against which she made representation to Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad which was not allowed by Administrative Committee of Hon'ble Court. The order of Hon'ble High Court was communicated to her through my office. This shows she is inhabit of raising voice (although this is her right) against head of institute inspite of improving herself.

Lastly Judicial Officer is again advised not to waste her time engaging herself to write confidential letter to District Judge justifying herself right and the District Judge wrong but to devote her time and energy for proving herself as an sincere and ideal judicial officer.

Respected Sir,

This is in reference to your letter DO no. 02/2020, dated 02.03.2020.

In the above mentioned letter, your good self has raised serious concerns with regards to my behavior and attitude while doing my judicial work. I wish to inform your good self that the contents of your above mentioned letter have surprised and disappointed me. All the observations/Allegations communicated by your good self are not only misplaced but they are certainly uncalled for. In fact, your good self has stated in the above mentioned letter that my behavior is not like a judge. Even though it is very disturbing to me and is causing a tremendous amount of mental stress, pain, agony and pressure on me. Because of the allegations/observations made by your good self in the above mentioned letter I am feeling very de-motivated and harassed.

None of the allegations made by your good self are specific in nature or based upon any facts. However, it is very demoralizing for me to note that your good self does not have faith in your own officer. Owing to the circumstances and for record, I would like to clarify/respond to these issues in the succeeding paragraphs:

1. **Oral Complaints against me from the side of Bar:** As mentioned by your good self that there are a number of oral complaints against me from the side of Bar against my working, behavior and attitude and your good self also personally feel that my behavior is not up to the mark and is not like a judge. Your good self has also mentioned that I have been instructed many times in the past, by your good self. I was rather surprised to know this, as, since the time your good self joined the Kanpur Nagar Judgeship in July 2019, till date your good self has neither mentioned or asked me any explanation regarding any complaint against me from the side of Bar nor have you pointed out on any occasion any lapses in my behavior, even once. It is most respectfully submitted that I joined judicial services in July 2015 and in last almost five years I have had the honour of working under various officers in Budaun as well as here in Kanpur Nagar, but none of my various superiors ever questioned or adversely commented about my abilities as a Judge and/or bad relations with the Bar. In fact, my relations with the Bar, have always been cordial and my conduct as a Judge has been impeccable. Remarks, regarding my relations with Bar, my conduct and behavior, in the last four Annual Confidential Reports initiated by previous Hon'ble District Judges, under whom I had the honour to serve will stand testimony to it. It is true that I don't fraternize with the Bar but that doesn't indicate that my relations are not cordial. It was taught to us in the Academy that "*You should keep in check the temptation to be a populist Judge*". Hence, I follow the first principle of natural justice i.e., *audi alteram partem*, and have made it a point to always accommodate Genuine requests for adjournments but I do not allow/tolerate nonsense and do not permit frivolous submissions, and requests for adjournment, dilatory tactics or misrepresentations. As it is my duty to maintain discipline and decorum in the Court. It has also been emphasized in point no. 3 of "**Restatement of Values of Judicial Life**", a Charter adopted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its full court on May 7, 1997, to serve as a guide to be observed by Judges, essential for independent, strong and respected judiciary, indispensable in the impartial administration of justice. This Resolution was preceded by a draft statement circulated to all the Hon'ble High Courts of the country and suitably redrafted in the light of the suggestions received. It has been described as the 'restatement of the pre-

existing and universally accepted norms, guidelines and conventions' observed by Judges. It is a complete code of the canons of judicial ethics. It reads as under:

1. XXXXXX
2. XXXXXX
3. Close association with individual members of the Bar, particularly those who practice in the same court, shall be eschewed.
4. XXXXXX

It is also pertinent to mention here that I do not bow down to pressures, while discharging my duties as a Judicial Officer. There have been instances when people have approached me outside the Court for getting a favourable order/Judgment. To mention one such instance, one Mr. Santosh Bajpayee, a court official (Stenographer) approached me for a favour in a Bail Matter (case crime no. 196/19 in the matter of Faisal Anwar vs. State) insisting upon me to grant bail to the accused/applicant. However, I have never succumbed to any of these types of pressures/approaches and have always decided the matter on its merit in accordance with Law. It is also pertinent to mention here that many of the matters decided by me have been challenged and been upheld in the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad. To mention a very recent and specific case, i.e., in the matter of Sh. Rajnish Jain Vs. The State of Uttar Pradesh, the bail application of the accused was rejected in my court. The said rejection of bail was upheld by the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad and subsequently, even the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SLP (Criminal) no. 2303 of 2020, refused to interfere in the matter. This in itself speaks volumes regarding my work as a Judicial Officer.

It has always been my endeavour to try, practice and to follow all that was taught to us in the academy and various guidelines/circulars/orders/rules put in place by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad and the State of Uttar Pradesh, to the best of my knowledge and capacity. If besides the above there is anything else, which I have to incorporate in my behavior, I am always open to suggestions from your good self and other esteemed seniors. Any suggestion along with a specific incident will be more than welcome.

2. **Behave like a Judge and not like Executive Officer or Police Officer:** Your good self in the above mentioned letter pointed out that I should behave like a Judge and not like an Executive Officer or a Police Officer without giving an incident or occurrence in which my behavior was unbecoming of a Judicial Officer. I just can't comprehend as to how I could be accused of not behaving as a "Judge". My first and foremost responsibility as a Judicial Officer is to discharge the judicial duties and uphold the law laid down. Hence, it is relevant to refer point no. 6.7 of the guidelines under the caption 'competence and diligence' in the Bangalore Principles of Judicial Conduct (2002) which is as under:

6.7 A judge shall not engage in conduct incompatible with the diligent discharge of judicial duties.

I must point out that I have been diligently and efficiently performing the duties of a judge since July 2015, i.e., for almost five years. I have consistently and conscientiously performed my duties as a Judge without any fear, favor or prejudice. However, I would have been highly obliged and grateful to your good self if the incidents/occurrences could have been included in the letter, wherein my behavior had deviated from the above or was not like a Judge so that I can improve in future.

3. **Always have patience:** In the above letter your good self has mentioned that I should have patience while sitting on Dais or while interacting with seniors or the Hon'ble District Judge. Please be rest assured that I have always assiduously conducted myself with utmost patience and understanding while sitting on Dais.

giving ample time and freedom to the Ld. Lawyers and/or Litigants. In fact, very recently in one of the bail cases. I heard the arguments of a Ld. Advocate, for three days in a row, very patiently. Your good self has included yourself in the above observation, hence, your good self must be having some specific instance in mind when I behaved impatiently with your good self. However, no specific instance/incident has been mentioned or included in the above mentioned letter regarding my impatient behavior with my respected seniors or your good self.

4. **Do not shout on lawyers and litigants while sitting on Dias:** It is not in my nature to shout on anyone, inside or outside the Court. I have never in my entire career shouted on any lawyer or a litigant, for that matter on anyone. Once again no specific incident/occurrence of the same has been mentioned in the above letter or was ever brought to my notice by your good self or anybody else.
5. **Hearing of Bail in remand/surrender cases:** In the above mentioned letter your good self has stated that all accused who are taken into custody or have surrendered have legal rights to move the bail application. Of course they do have. It is settled law. That right is absolutely not questionable. I am fully aware that right 'to move bail' application by an accused person, is the basic tenet of jurisprudence. I have never ever curtailed the legal rights of any accused to prefer an application for bail. I have been scrupulously ensuring that every application for bail was promptly heard and judiciously decided on the merits of the case as well as within the framework of law. If there is any reason due to which the same could not be done, reason for the same is always mentioned in my orders. It would have been very helpful to me if an incident/occurrence regarding the same had been included in the above letter.
6. **Always be moderate and not conservative with an open mind:** Your good self has mentioned that I should be moderate and not conservative and should have open mind. In this regard I wish to respectfully inform your good self that in pursuit of my judicial career and responsibilities, it has been my settled practice to always follow five ethical principles – *judicial aloofness and detachment, honesty and integrity, judicial independence, judicial temperament with humility, and impartiality*, as were taught to us in the Academy. Besides, legally or even ethically, I have never ventured to exploit any latitude to temper my formal obligations by selective 'moderation' or 'conservatism'. Most relevant to this issue is judicial aloofness, which is conditioning of mind to be aloof, maintaining detachment from the arena of contest and rendering justice unmindful of the consequences and to dispassionately decide who is right and who is wrong in accordance with law. My duty as a Judicial Officer is to uphold and implement the Law, as it has been laid down. This advice from your good self would have been more useful to me had some actual incident/occurrence in this context along with shortcoming in my conduct and the proper way it should have been dealt with, was mentioned in the letter.
7. **Always have control over court and work:** Your good self has mentioned in the above said letter that I should have control over my court and work. If I am not able to cope with the work then I should not blame others. It is most respectfully submitted that I am quite punctilious about court and routine work. All Court requirements of the day including misc. work are completed before I leave for the day. There is no question of blaming anyone on that score. If your good self had included an incident or a name of the person I have blamed for my extra work, would have been a great help.
8. **Always be amenable to the advice of District Judge:** Your good self has advised me in the above said letter to be amenable to the Hon'ble District Judge. In this regard it is most respectfully submitted that I have highest of regards for the office of the Hon'ble District Judge and all my esteemed seniors. I have always endeavoured to be courteous and deferential to my seniors. I constantly seek advice and guidance from my respected seniors, as I fully understand and comprehend that they are much more experienced and knowledgeable than me. I have always adhered to all the

advice given by your good self as well. For instance, a very recent and specific occurrence does come to my mind that on 29.02.2020, around 4.45PM, (after the Dais time, which is upto 4.30PM) two bail applications were moved in my court, after which, your good self called me to your office and enquired about the case, wherein I explained the whole situation to you and your good self orally directed me to dispose the bail applications on the same day. Upon the directions of your good self, I heard the bail applications and disposed it on the same day on merit, even though it was after the court working hours. Also I have never hesitated in seeking and following advice and guidance from my seniors when necessary.

9. It may please be appreciated that I have been carrying out my professional duties with absolute integrity, utmost diligence and responsibility. I have put in almost five years of unblemished service and have naturally earned very good reports from my superiors.

Lastly I would like to most respectfully submit that all the observations/allegations raised by your good self in the above mentioned letter are not supported by any concrete/specific incident/occurrence. It is most likely that someone with ulterior motives has purposefully misguided/misinformationed you with regards to my conduct/behaviour. I am afraid that in future also some unscrupulous person with sinister design may try to fabricate/raise false allegations against me. Hence, it is with utmost humility, humbly and respectfully submitted that before believing on any such incident/allegation your good self should have faith in me and grant an opportunity to explain myself.

I can assure you that under your able guidance & benign supervision, I shall continue to improve as an ideal Judicial Officer.




