As per the self assessment, the officer was posted as Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kushi Nagar w.e.f. 15.04.2021 to 31.03.2022.

Perused the remark given to the officer by the District Judge. The officer has annexed yearwise break up of Institution and Disposal of cases during the assessment year which shows that the cases of the year 1991 to 2000 are still pending and no plausible reason has been shown for its non-disposal of cases having age of more than 20 years. The officer should have made earnest endeavour to dispose of the very old cases.

On overall assessment, I do not agree with the remarks given by the District Judge in putting him in the category of 'Very Good' and accordingly, he is downgraded and put in the category of 'Good' Officer.
