

Respected Sir,

This is in reference to your letter no. 6075/IV-4333/Admin.(A-4) Dated 11.04.2018 wherein your goodself had asked for certain information with respect to my letter no 388/XV/6A dated 05.05.2017 for granting permission to pursue my LL.M. Course (Correspondence). In this respect i shall state that the UPPSC had declared the UP PCS-J 2015 results on 05.08.2016 in which i was selected with a merit rank of 35. A copy of said result is attached herewith for your kind perusal. Further I had taken admission in LL.M. course in september, 2016 at the Directorate of Distance Education, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra for 2016-2018 batch and i was appointed as Additional Civil Judge (J.D.) only on 18th january, 2017 at Ambedkar Nagar which is much ahead of my taking admission in LL.M. Course.

The examination datesheet pertaining to 1st Year LL.M. was issued by the University sometime in the month of May, 2017 and thereafter the applicant had written a letter on 05.05.2017 to the Hon'ble High Court seeking permission to appear in the examination and further in anticipation of grant of permission had appeared in LL.M. 1st year examination which was scheduled in May-June 2017. A copy of said letter is attached herewith for your kind perusal.

This is to say that Directorate of Distance Education Kurukshetra University was established in year 1976 with a moto to provide an opportunity of higher education to the persons who could not continue their studies because of reasons beyond their control. A copy of said prospectus is attached herewith for your kind perusal. This is also to add that i have passed the 1st year exams without attending day to day classes. Thus course of Master of Laws (LL.M.) through distance learning from Kurukshetra University does not require attending of day to day classes. I assures your goodself that judicial work will not suffer on account of the undersigned pursuing this course, but the same will be helpful in proper dispensation of my duties. It is also stated that I shall not be required to avail study leave for pursuing this course. The documents in this regard are attached.

Further this is to say that i was new to the service and was not aware about the circulars issued by Hon'ble High Court, as and when i got to know about the circulars pertaining to higher education same was intimated by me to the Hon'ble High Court.

I shall also state that the Course and the University is recognised by the UGC. A copy of letter issued by the University and the UGC is attached herewith for your kind perusal.

It is therefore most respectfully requested to allow the undersigned to pursue the course of LLM through distance learning as a candidate for the LL.M. Examination must pass the whole examination (Previous as well as Final) within Five Years and the session 2020-2021 is the last year. I shall forever be grateful.
