

SCHEME FOR THREE-YEAR LL.M. COURSE

August to December

1st Term :

The students may opt any *two* of the following courses :

- (i) Administrative Process ;
- (ii) Federalism ;
- (iii) Law of International Organisation and Human Rights ;
- (iv) Comparative Study of Law Relating to Employer-Employee Relations ;
- (v) Juvenile Delinquency ;
- (vi) Intellectual and Industrial Property Laws-I (Copyright and Neighbouring Rights and Industrial Designs).

January to May

2nd Term :

The students may opt any *one* of the following courses in addition to subject (i) "Comparative Jurisprudence", a foundation course, which is compulsory for all LL.M. students :

- (i) Comparative Jurisprudence ;
- (ii) Civil Liberties ;
- (iii) Law of Corporate Finance and Securities Regulation ;
- (iv) Social and Economic Offences ;
- (v) Law Relating to Wages and Monetary Benefits ;
- (vi) Intellectual and Industrial Property Laws - II (Patents and the Role of Patents in the Transfer of Technology to Developing Countries ; Trade Marks and Unfair Competition).

August to December

3rd Term :

The students may opt any *two* of the following courses :

- (i) Administrative Discretion and Judicial Review ;
- (ii) Law and Practice of Treaties ;
- (iii) Tax Policies and Tax Reforms ;
- (iv) Comparative Criminal Procedure and Evidence ;
- (v) Statutory Law Relating to Testamentary and Intestate Succession;
- (vi) Environmental Law.

January to May

4th Term :

The student may opt any *two* of the following courses :

- (i) Techniques of Judicial Control ;
- (ii) Rehabilitative Techniques and Correctional Administration ;
- (iii) Religious and charitable Endowments ;
- (iv) Islamic Jurisprudence ;
- (v) Monopolies and Restrictive Trade Practices ;
- (vi) Air and Space Law ;
- (vii) Law Relating to International Water Resources.

August to December

5th Term :

The students may opt any *two* of the following courses in addition to subject (i) "Legal and Social Science Research Methods", a foundation course, which is compulsory for all LL.M. students :

- (i) Legal and Social Science Research Methods ;
- (ii) Law of the Sea ;
- (iii) Law and Society ;
- (iv) Marriage and Divorce in Conflict of Laws ;
- (v) International Economic Institutions ;
- (vi) Corporate Management.

Note : The foundation course in "Legal and Social Science Research Methods" shall consist of 100 marks like other courses but out of 100 marks in this course, 50 marks will be based on written class performance and 50 marks on *viva voce* examination conducted by an outside expert. The purpose of this course is to assist the students in improving their performance in writing dissertation in Sixth Term.

January to May

6th Term :

A dissertation carrying a maximum of 200 marks on a topic approved by the Faculty of Law has to be submitted on or before 30th April of the year in which the candidate is a student of the VI Term. In special cases, however, the Dean may permit a student to submit his dissertation after 30th April but not later than 31st August of the year. In case the dissertation is not submitted by 31st August as aforesaid, the candidate will have to register as an ex-student in accordance with the provision of the Ordinance relating to ex-students of the University of Delhi.

As an ex-student, a candidate may submit his dissertation as follows :

1. Last week of October ;
2. Last week of January ;
3. Last week of April and, with permission of the Dean, not later than 31st August of that year ;

Provided that such students, who register themselves as ex-students either for submission of dissertation or for clearing any of the subject, may be given the degree of the academic year in which they clear all the requirements of the LL.M. examination.

Note : In a case where a student fails to obtain the required percentage of marks in the dissertation submitted by him, he should be permitted to revise and resubmit the dissertation on the same topic or on a fresh topic (to be approved in the prescribed manner) if he so desires. Further, should the student desire to revise and resubmit the dissertation on the same topic, extracts from the report of the examiner as to the defects in the dissertation be made available to the student to enable him to revise and resubmit the same.
