## NOTES

## FOR M.A./M.SC./M.COM Examination

- In case of final year examination, minimum percentage of marks for a pass in first/second division and pass class is 60%, 48% and 36% respectively in the aggregate marks of all the years taken together.
- 2. For a pass in the examination, a candidate is required to obtain at least 25% in each paper and 36% marks in the total aggregate in theory at the Previous and Final Examination separately and 36% marks in practical separately, wherever prescribed.
- 3. (a) A candidate who has failed at M.A./M.Sc./M.Com Previous Examination but has passed in atleast 50% of the paper prescribed for the examination obtaining 36% marks in each paper in accordance with the rules given below shall be eligible to re-appear in the failing papers of previous along with the Final examination.
  - (b) A candidate who has failed at the M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. Final Examination but has passed in atleast 50% of the paper obtaining 36% marks in each paper prescribed for the examination in accordance with the rules given in clause below shall be exempted from reappearing in a subsequent year in the papers he has passed.
  - (i) Where the candidate fails to secure the requisite minimum percentage of marks prescribed for a pass in the aggregate of all the papers he shall be deemed to have passed in each such paper in which he has secured atleast 36% marks.
  - (ii) Where the candidate secures the requisite minimum percentage of marks prescribed for a pass in the aggregate of all the papers he shall be deemed to have passed in each such paper in which he has secured atleast 25% marks.
  - (iii) For reckoning 50% of the papers at the Previous or Final Examination, practical will be included and one practical will be counted as one
  - (iv) If the number of papers prescribed at the Previous or Final Examination is an odd number, it shall be increased by one for the purpose of reckoning 50% of the papers.
- 4. (a) A candidate who does not pass even in 50% of the papers prescribed for the M.A/M.Sc./M.Com (Previous) examination in accordance with the above rules shall not be eligible for admission to M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. (Final) class. He will be required to re-appear at the Previous examination in all the prescribed papers and practicals.
  - (b) A candidate who does not pass even in 50% of the papers prescribed for the M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. (Final) examination in accordance with the above rules shall be required to re-appear at the same in a subsequent year in all the prescribed papers and practicals.
- 5. If a candidate clears any paper(s)/practical(s)/dissertation/Viva-voce prescribed at the Previous and / or Final examination separately after a continued period of three years, for the purpose of working out his/her division only, the minimum pass marks viz. 25% (36% in case of Practicals) shall be taken into account in respect of such paper(s) / practical(s)/dissertation as are cleared after the aforesaid period provided that in case where a candidate requires more than 25% marks in order to reach the requisite minimum aggregate as many marks out of those actually secured by him will be taken into account as would enable him to make up the deficiency in the requisite minimum aggregate (Ord212B)
- Candidate desiring scrutiny of their result and/or revaluation of their answer-books should apply on the prescribed form so as to reach the
  Registrar before expiry of 15 days from the date of declaration of result. Application received after the due date shall not be entertained in any
  case.
- 7. In case of any mistake being detected during the preparation of the marksheet or brought to the notice afterwards, the University will be fully empowered to correct the same. (Ord. 169H)
- 8. For remaining instructions candidates are advised to see Rules, Regulations and Ordinances of the University.
- 9. For M.Sc. Applied Chemistry, Micro-Biology, Food & Nutrition, M.B.A., L.L.M., M.Phill and Diploma Examinations (See Rules & Regulation of the University).
- 10. Star shown against the subject / paper denotes failure in that subject / paper.
- 11. If any mistake / error is required to be corrected, send this mark sheet to the University within Six months of the declaration of the result along with specific request for correction.
- 12. Accordigate who holds the degree of Master of Laws of this University or of any other University recognised as equivalent to the Master of Laws degree of this University may be permitted to appear at the LLM Pt-II exam in any branch, in which he has not already qualified for the Master of Laws degree without having undergone regular course of study & if successful will be given a certificate to that effect. For a pass a candidate shall be required to secure 40% marks in each paper & 50% in the aggregate of all the papers procedure to the examination. (Ord. 257A)
