
- 1- Any adverse situation towards The Government of India or the State Government is unlikely to arise after going abroad of under-signatory.

(j) Issue of Indentity Certificate for obtaining a Passport was never refused to me.

(k) I have not visited any foreign country earlier.

(l) My family dependent members are my father Shri Prem Chand Bharti, my wife Renu Bharti, my elder son Naveen Bharti & younger son Ayush Bharti.
