Subject: Permission for foreign travel for visiting an elderly unwell close family member in London, United Kingdom

Respected Sir,

Most respectfully, I would like to bring to your attention that my wife Mrs Bharti Tripathi's uncle (her father's brother), Mr Shambhoo Tiwari (94 years old) is very unwell. He lives in London and has recently returned home after 2 months in Homerton hospital and is now bedridden. Mr Tiwari has expressed his wish to see me and my wife along with our 4 years old child, especially as he was unable to attend our wedding in 2018 in India due to his illness.

My wife's sister, Dr Nimisha Tripathi, who is an academic in the University of Greenwich, and lives in Kent, England is happy to host us thereby enabling us to spend time with Mr Shambhoo Tiwari.

We would very much wish to see our Uncle at this difficult time. I would like to seek permission to travel from the Hon'ble High Court, UP. I would plan to use my Earned Leave (EL) to undertake this trip, which is anticipated between the 18th June-27th June, 2024. Dr Nimisha Tripathi has offered to pay our travel tickets and also our stay and subsistence during this trip will be hosted by her.

I have a valid Passport (No. Z6563471) issued by Regional Passport Officer in Lucknow on 24/03/2022, which is valid until 23/03/2032. As mentioned above, the expenses of this proposed foreign trip will be borne by Dr Nimisha Tripathi. An invitation letter from Dr Nimisha Tripathi is being attached with this application. I would also like to submit my bank statements for your kind perusal.

Further, I undertake:

1. I am a Citizen of Republic of India by birth.
2. I will not do any act in the United Kingdom, which harms the Integrity and Sovereignty of Republic of India.
3. My foreign travel will not bring insult or shame to Republic of India and State of Uttar Pradesh.
4. My foreign travel will not affect Republic of India's friendly relation with any other country.
5. My foreign travel will not threaten security of Republic of India.
6. There is no Criminal Case pending against me in any Court in Republic of India.
7. I will be staying with the close family member on my proposed foreign trip.
8. By my abroad visit, no dilemma is likely to be created before the Government of India or before Government of Uttar Pradesh.
9. I have never been refused for abroad visit, nor I have visited any foreign country.

Following these facts and undertakings, I seek the Hon'ble Court's kind consideration on my application and permission to travel to the United Kingdom on the above-mentioned dates.
