## Joint Registrar (Judicial) (Budget)

May kindly see the online application of Sri Neeraj Kumar Bakshi, Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Maharajganj regarding grant of permission to visit Triveni ji and other religious and tourist places in Nepal alongwith his family members and relatives in the month of "Magh" between 27.01.2022 and 08.02.2022 for a day or two.

In his application, Sri Neeraj Kumar Bakshi has stated that he has to go with his family members and relatives to Triveni ji and other religious and tourist places in Nepal. His mother and other old aged relatives wishes to take holy bath in the holy river Triveni ji in the month of "Magh". Other related information/ declaration as per C.L.No 16 dated 27.05.2017 are as follows:-

1. There is no possibility of arising any dilemma before the Government of India or U.P. due to his visit to Nepal.

2. No such request was refused earlier.

3. No earlier foreign country visit.

4. The estimated expenditure is approximately Rs.15000/-( Fifteen thousand only).

On asking about certain details further, the officer has also submitted that the distance of Triveni ji (Nepal) from Maharajaganj is near about 60 Kms only. He can do up and down for that place only in 1 or 2 days using one-day casual leave prefixing/suffixing Sunday/Other holiday. The application for casual leave and station leave shall be submitted to Principal Judge, Maharajganj separately in case he got permission from the Hon'ble High Court.

He has, therefore, requested kindly to permit him to go to the foreign country Nepal between 27.01.2022 to 08.02.2022, for which he shall be highly obliged to the Hon'ble Court.

In this connection, it is submitted that in terms of G.O. No.8/12/11/ CX dated 16.3.1971, all Government servants visiting Nepal must take prior permission of the Head of the Department before visiting Nepal and they should enter Nepal territory through some custom check-post and get their luggage cleared by the custom authorities. It is also mentioned in the G.O. that permission to go to Nepal will be given only when Head of the Department is satisfied that the visit of Nepal by the Government servant is necessary and unavoidable. It is also submitted that as per the reports, placed below, no departmental/ vigilance enquiry is pending against Sri Neeraj Kumar Bakshi.

Permission to visit abroad is also considered in accordance with the G.O.1/3/98-Ka-Prasko/1999 dated 14 June 1999 and in accordance with Hon'ble High Court's Circular Letter No. 16/ IV-f-101/ Admin (A)/ dated 27.05.2017. As the officer is willing to visit Nepal for a day or two by using one-day casual leave prefixing/suffixing Sunday/Other holiday, his application appears to be considerable, however, he is required to intimate the actual date of his departure and returns to India before proceeding onto his journey. Now, it is at the discretion of the Hon'ble High Court either to grant him permission or to pass any such order which deems to be proper.

In this connection it is also submitted that in the Hon'ble High Court's Circular Letter dated 27.05.2017, it has been settled that for the purpose of grant of such permission, Hon'ble The Chief Justice will be the competent authority for the Judicial Officers, posted in the High Court, Allahabad, its bench at Lucknow and those who are on deputation outside the State, and Hon'ble the Administrative Judge of the district concerned, for the Judicial officers posted in Judgeship or in the District on any deputation post, subject to approval by Hon'ble the Chief Justice or any other member of the Administrative Committee authorised by the Hon'ble Chief Justice. Vide subsequent order dated 19.10.2020, Hon'ble The Chief Justice has been pleased to nominate Hon'ble Mr. Justice Pritinker Diwaker, to consider request of permission of the Judicial Officers to visit abroad in His Lordship's place.

May, therefore, if approved, the instant matter may be laid before Hon'ble Mr. Justice Vikas

Kunvar Srivastav, Administrative Judge, Maharajganj for kind perusal and if His Lordship approves, Sri Neeraj Kumar Bakshi, Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Maharajganj may be granted permission to visit Triveni ji and other religious and tourist places in Nepal alongwith his family members and relatives between 27.01.2022 and 08.02.2022 for a day or two by availing only one-day casual leave prefixing/suffixing Sunday/Other holiday, as requested, subject to approval by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Pritinker Diwaker, Nominated Judge, as per Hon'ble High Court's Circular Letter No. 16/ IV-f-101/ Admin (A)/ dated 27.05.2017 and order dated 19.10.2020 of Hon'ble The Chief Justice, as mentioned above with the conditions that he will intimate the actual date of his departure and returns to India before proceeding onto his journey, will enter Nepal territory through some custom check-post only and get his luggage cleared by Customs Authorities as well as, proper charge of Government records or cash, if any, or any government property with him, may be handed over by him before proceeding abroad?

Or

To pass any other order, which His Lordship deems fit and proper.
