SHORT SENSORY PROFILE REPORT

Aryansh's sensory profile report completed by his mother shows these raw scores in each section:

- Tactile sensitivity: 27/35
- Smell/taste sensitivity: 12/20
- Movement sensitivity: 09/15
- Under responsive /seek sensation: 11/35
- Auditory filtering: 15/30
- Low energy/weak: 21/30
- Visual/auditory sensitivity: 17/25

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The scores show that aryansh has a definite and probable difference in Tactile sensitivity, Movement sensitivity, under-responsive/Seeks sensation, Auditory Filtering and Low energy/Weak, Visual/auditory sensitivity. This means A child with a Definite and probable Difference score in this pattern seeks sensory input at a higher rate than others.

This means that the child is over-responsive to sensory input or is responding to counteract the threshold. This indicates that this sensory input is confusing, upsetting or not meaningful to the child and interfering with Aryansh's ability to complete important activities of daily living as successfully as others do.

Typical performance in Smell/taste sensitivity means he can effectively understand what is happening around him.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Aryansh requires individualized Occupational Regularly to improve his functional skills in the above-nentioned areas. This should include Sensory Integration Therapy, as well as gross motor, fine motor, play development behaviour and independent engagement in the activity.
- The family must work closely with the therapist to understand his strengths and issues
